
Executive Summary

IMAGE '25, held 25–28 August at the George R. Brown Convention Center in Houston, Texas, brought together **7,897 attendees** from 83 countries, reaffirming its role as the premier multidisciplinary meeting for the geoscience and energy community. The event drew a **diverse audience** spanning geophysicists, geologists, engineers, academics, and other professionals, with nearly three-quarters of participants bringing more than 16 years of industry experience. North America led the way in attendees, with strong representation from Europe, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East.

The technical program reflected IMAGE's strength in knowledge-sharing, with **1,131 accepted abstracts** across 292 sessions (163 oral and 129 poster). Attendee feedback highlighted the event's impact, with **92% rating IMAGE '25 good to excellent**, 88% praising the mix of technical content, and 91% rating networking opportunities highly. Importantly, 74% of attendees influence purchasing decisions, reinforcing IMAGE's position as a hub for new business as well as innovation.

The exhibition and special features showcased the breadth of the energy landscape with **212 exhibitors**, supported by themed pavilions: Digitalization, Near-Surface, Carbon Management, and Global Energy Opportunities, each drawing hundreds of participants and top-tier sponsors. The Geothermal Hub expanded engagement with emerging energy sectors, while executive sessions, workshops, short courses, field trips, and networking opportunities deepened learning and connections.

Overall, IMAGE '25 successfully **united geoscience and energy professionals worldwide**, spotlighted cutting-edge technologies, and fostered collaboration across traditional and low-carbon sectors. High satisfaction, diverse participation, and strong exhibitor engagement underscore IMAGE's continued growth and influence heading into IMAGE '26.







Since its launch, IMAGE has delivered five consecutive years of growth, establishing itself as the go-to event for geoscience and energy leaders worldwide.

With **attendance surging** year after year from 2,216 in 2021 to nearly 8,000 in 2025, IMAGE has cemented itself as the premier platform for innovation, collaboration, and industry advancement.

IMAGE ATTENDANCE GROWTH












Company Types

Age Breakdown






